

# **Ministry Moment**

The Maria Stein Shrine is excited to be adding eleven saints to our historic collection this autumn. These relics will be put into the chapel for public veneration by the faithful who come here on pilgrimage. These modern heroes lived exemplary lives of holiness and illustrate to us how to live out our faith in both good and difficult times.

We invite you to visit the Relic Chapel to pray with them. Below is a list of the Saints that will be added to our collection.

#### **Bl. James Miller**

BI. James Miller was an American member of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. He was martyred in 1982 in Guatemala while serving the poor and oppressed there.





St. Elizabeth of the Trinity

St. Elizabeth was a French Discalced Carmelite Sister who was a mystic and spiritual writer. She was known for her persistence in pursuing the will of God.

#### Bl. Adèle de Batz de Trenquelléon

BI. Adele co-founded the Marianist Sisters with BI. William Joseph Chaminade in 1816. They were founded to care for the poor and are affiliated with the University of Dayton.





Sts. Louis & Zelie Martin

The Martins are the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux (and four other nuns) and an example of a holy Christian marriage. They are the first couple to be canonized together.



St Paul VI was pope from 1963-1978. He continued the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) and implemented many of its reforms during his papacy.





St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross

St. Teresa (Edith Stein) was a Jewish philosopher who converted to Catholicism. In 1942 the Nazis arrested her and took her to Auschwitz where she was murdered.



St. Oscar Romero was a bishop in El Salvador who advocated for the poor and those oppressed by the government. He was martyred while celebrating Mass in 1980.





#### St. Josemaria Escriva

St. Josemaria was a Spanish priest who founded Opus Dei. This organization promotes the universal call to holiness in the ordinary lives of priests and lay people.



St. Josephine was taken from Africa as a slave and remained one until 1889 when she was given her freedom. A year later, she converted spending the rest of her life as a nun.





### **Bl. Basil Moreau**

Bl. Basil was a French priest who founded the Congregation of the Holy Cross. This group of priests would come to America and found the University of Notre Dame in Indiana.
